MILLER ROAD C&D WASTE DISPOSAL SITE HOURS

Tuesday to Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Permits must be obtained from Deep River Town Office during their regular business hours. Construction and demolition waste is defined as all non-hazardous low metal content waste from construction and demolition clean up projects, consisting primarily of; wood, blocks/stone/bricks, non-metal roofing material, insulation, waste furniture (does not include mattresses and box springs), window glass, non metal siding material, concrete and small amounts of plastic and fiberglass. Summer Hours: March 11 to November 3, 2013, Tuesday 9 a.m. - 6 p.m. and Wednesday to Saturday 9a.m. - 4 p.m.

METHODS for Paying your TAXES and WATER/SEWER

Pre-Authorized, Cash, Cheque, On-line Banking (at participating banks), or at the Scotiabank Branch in Deep River. **Cheques** for taxes and water payments may be left in the night deposit box in Chalk River at 19 Railway or in Point Alexander 34465 Highway 17 at the main office. The Municipality **will not** be responsible for cash left in the drop box. **Do Not Put Cash in the Drop Box.**

TAX INSTALMENT DUE DATES

The 2013 Final Tax Billings will be sent out in July. Payments are due on August 22 and October 24.

WATER/SEWER BILLING

The May/June billing is due June 30, 2013.

The July/August billing is due August 31, 2013.

Important Information Regarding **STYROFOAM**

The following items are **NOT** acceptable for recycling. Blue or pink rigid insulation (e.g. packing around new TV's) pipe insulation and packing peanuts, soft/bendable foam. They should be placed with your **regular garbage**. Meat trays with plastic covering and absorbent pads that are removed **ARE** acceptable with regular recycling. Rigid foam that is free of tape is acceptable as well.

URGENT MEASURES NEEDED FOR BAGGS ROAD LANDFILL!

2012 was a bad year for the Baggs Rd Landfill. The volume filled was **20% higher** than the average of the five previous years. **50%** of materials in garbage bags destined to be landfilled are actually RECYCLABLE. Reducing, reusing, recycling and composting will extend the life of our current landfill site, saving us tax dollars. **50%** of the materials in the garbage bags that are being landfilled are recyclable. With the value of landfill volume estimated at \$78 per cubic meter, this means the lost value of landfill volume for 2012 alone is about **\$240,000!** This loss will soon translate into money that we will have to pay through our taxes if a new landfill must be found. This cost will be more than 2.5 million. Bag limits may be considered by the Town to encourage people that don't recycle to begin.
